

#### Tell us how business is!

Helping sustain the economic vitality of the District, which includes Downtown and North Main, is a mission of the Business Improvement District. And because "improvement" is a part of our title, the BID intends to take the term literally this year and continue to look toward improving the business climate for constituents.

(And, as we know, improving business in the BID helps strengthen all of La Plata County. No effort is too small.)

To improve, however, we need to have some kind of a baseline and know where we stand. City sales and lodger's taxes are two ways to get a general idea, but what we've recently noted is that though revenues from both were up in 2014, the good news wasn't necessarily spread equitably across the board. For example, restaurants did quite well last year, and pulled up that sales tax number. We want – indeed need – to know how everyone else is doing.

To that end, the BID has put together a short survey that we hope all businesses will take – even if you're not in the BID. It shouldn't take any more than 10 minutes, if that, and it's completely confidential. Understanding both the good economic news from businesses and the challenges will assist the BID in our developing programs, and position those programs during the appropriate time of year.

An optional write-in comment section is also included for folks to share any suggestions and ideas they may have. For example, how can the BID be a voice for our constituents?

The tabulated results from the survey will also be shared with elected officials and key decision makers in the county to help them better shape policy and plans going forward.

Communication, education, information – they're all important as we go forward with "improvement" efforts.






