LPC Sales Tax Update

• Sales tax collections for January show a decrease of \$423,800 or -25.83% in comparison to the same period in 2021. No year to date analysis is present as only a single month's data is available.

Durango-La Plata County Airport Update

- Frontier Airlines will restore nonstop service between Durango and Las Vegas' Harry Reid International Airport starting June 9, 2022.
- Face masks are now optional for passengers and employees.
- DRO will be rehabilitating Runway 3/21 in September 2022. A full runway closure is planned for Wednesday, Sept. 7 – Friday, Sept. 16, 2022.

Downtown Durango Update

- The city of Durango is hosting a community open house Thursday, May 19, from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. at the Fort Lewis College Center for Innovation, 835 Main Ave. Suite 225. The public will have the opportunity to provide feedback on the draft conceptual streetscape design for Downtown Main Avenue both at the meeting and online from May 2 22.

Affordable Housing Update

- The La Plata County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) approved a resolution that establishes the "Investment in Affordable Housing Revolving Loan Fund".
- The fund will provide loans and grants to eligible projects and entities that require assistance with affordable housing projects.
- The fund starts with \$1.7 million in ARPA funds and the first recipient to make use of the fund is Elevation Community Land Trust, the purchaser of the Westside Mobile Home Park.

Homeless Camp Update

- The LPC BOCC agreed to purchase 4 parcels of land for the purpose of creating a managed homeless camp.
- The land is located on US Highway 160 near the Dog Park, has 2 existing buildings and 2 mobile homes on it, and is priced at \$1.7 million.
- The closing is expected to take place between July 15 and November 1 this year, contingent upon the City of Durango approving a land use application.
- La Plata County is currently in the process of due diligence.
 - At a joint meeting with the City of Durango Thursday, the Board of County Commissioners asked for three things:
 - issuance of an emergency ordinance authorizing the use of the land as a managed camp
 - expedited planning review
 - o continued use of joint sales tax for the establishment, operation and maintenance of the camp
- No decisions were made, but staff was directed to move forward with drafting an emergency ordinance. The discussion will continue at the next joint meeting, which will be in 3 months if a special meeting is not scheduled sooner.

LPEA Update

- Wholesale power supply cooperative Tri-State Generation and Transmission Association on April 28 filed with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) a settlement agreement with numerous parties, including Tri-State utility members LPEA, Poudre Valley Rural Electric Association (PVREA) and San Miguel Power Association (SMPA) on partial requirements memberships.
- With FERC approval, Tri-State's utility members can utilize the flexible option to self-supply up to 50% of their load requirements, in addition to members' current 5% self-supply and community solar options.
